5. EXAM

Requirements for taking the final exam is orderly attendance to all teaching activities during the course of Dermatology.

The exam is composed of the written test (40 questions with one correct answer) and oral exam that equally contribute to the final mark. Successful completion of the written test is prerequisite for the oral exam. Once passed written exam is valid throughout the current academic year.

Written exam - contains 40 questions covering all areas of Dermatology. All questions are multiple choice with one correct answer out of 4- 5. Students have 120 minutes for completing the test. Minimum of 25 correct answers/ points are required for passing. The marks correspond to the test points as follows:

37-40 excellent (5)

33-36 very good (4)

29-32 good (3)

25-28 sufficient (2)
