Instructions for practical exam

Candidates should bring white coats and pencil to the exam and should arrive on time.

The exam consists of 25 questions and is divided in two parts. In the first part (so called the **flagrace**) there are 20 stations with one question per station. An anatomical structure displayed in a station should be recognized and correctly named. The second part of the exam includes recognizing and naming of 5 structures on the cadaver.

Marks:

<u>18-19 – pass</u> 20-21 – good 22-23 – very good 24-25 – excellent

Structures that need to be recognized are indicated in one of following ways:

- covered by tape,
- rapped around by a wire or tape,
- foramina/openings are indicated by insertion of a piece of wire,

- structure can be indicated with a flagged needle, the number of the flag correlate with the exam question.

The answer is correct if:

- indicated structure is recognized,
- the name of structure has to be correctly entered using CAPITAL LETTERS,
- the spelling of anatomical names should be correct (in English)!

- in case when a particular structure DOES NOT exist anywhere else in the body (eg. **Medial malleolus**) it is not necessary to name the organ/bone on which the structure is located,

- in case when a particular structure DOES exist somewhere else in the body (eg. **Spine**) the organ/bone on which the structure is located should be correctly named (eg. **Spine of scapula**),

- misspelling will not be tolerated!

1st part of the exam – "FLAGRACE"

- every student will get a number that correlate with her/his starting question, that number should be encircled on the exam form,

- all student enter the room together and walk until they arrive at their station (that correlate with allocated/encircled number),

- there is 45 seconds allocated for every station,
- after the bell, students move to the next station in a clockwise direction,
- leaning on or touching specimens is strictly forbidden!

2nd part of the exam – "CADAVER"

- students enter the room one by one and after completion of the exam remain seated in the room until the last student from the group completes the exam,

- there are 5 structures clearly indicated by small flags,

- the technician will firstly show all 5 structures to a student,

- following this, a student has 2 minutes time for entering names of indicated structures

- the exam is completed when a last student in the group finishes this part of practical examination.

MARKING OF PRACTICAL EXAMINATION

Students will be asked to remain in the examination room until all exams are marked (usually only several minutes following the last student), the examiner will distribute marked exam forms and provide correct answers. Students have a chance to check their answers and to check specimens. No complaints will be accepted after this phase of practical exam! Following this, oral examination terms will be announced for students who passed practical exam.
