Cranium: viscerocranium and external features

GENERAL OBJECTIVES:

- general considerations of internal surface of cranial base
- anterior, middle and posterior cranial fossae
- foramina and other apertures of cranial fossae

SPECIFIC OBJECTIVES:

Facial aspects

- -Frontal bone, squamous part, glabella, nasion, supraorbital margins
- -Zygomatic bones
- -Maxillae with alveolar processes, infraorbital foramen
- -Mandible with body and ramus, mental foramina and protuberance

Lateral aspects

- -Temporal fossa with temporal lines
- -Zygomatic arch, pterion
- -External acoustic opening (pore), mastoid and styloid processes

Occipital aspects

- -Squamous part of occipital bone with protuberance
- -Zygomatic arch, pterion

Superior aspects

- -Parietal and frontal eminences
- -Coronal, sagittal and lambdoid sutures
- -Vertex

External surface of cranial base

-From anterior to posterior all features and principle communication should be recognized and named.
