

## GRADING PROCEDURE

**Grading** is based on an absolute scale. Scores of two partial written exams (B1 and B2) and a comprehensive final exam (practicals, P11) are the principal means of accumulating points.

Students who attended seminars and practicals are allowed to write partial written exams and attend final practical exam. Unprepared or missed seminars or practicals should be compensated by oral colloquium no later than 7 days after the absence, which is the requirement to attend the partial exams.

Students are obliged to register for the exam. If they do not register, they will not be allowed to take the exam!

### Grading procedures

Total accumulated points in written partial exams and comprehensive final exam (practicals) will be comprised of the following:

Medical biochemistry 1 (B1)	45	27
Medical biochemistry 2 (B2)	55	33
<u>Final exam-practicals</u>	<u>5</u>	<u>3</u>
<b>Total number of points possible</b>	<b>105</b>	<b>63</b>

### Point intervals of the total number of points scored in written and practical exam:

63 – 72.5	sufficient (2)
73 – 83.5	good (3)
84 – 94	very good (4)
94.5 – 105	excellent (5)

### The final grade represents the arithmetic mean of TWO grades:

First grade: written exam B1 + written exam B2 + practical exam

Second grade: oral exam
